Staphylococcus aureus

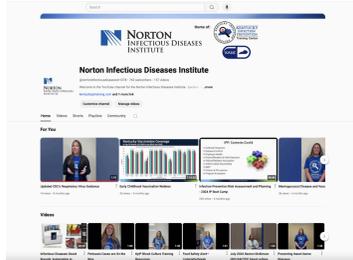
Staphylococcus aureus is a gram-positive coccus that appears in singles, pairs, or clusters. Non-motile and non-sporing, it is a facultative anaerobe commonly found on the skin and in the nasal passages without causing harm. Under the right conditions, however, this ordinarily quiet colonizer can lead to severe—and sometimes life-threatening—infections. *S. aureus* can cause a wide range of diseases, from skin and soft-tissue infections to bone infections and serious device-associated or other healthcare-acquired infections. Its ability to develop antibiotic resistance, most notably as methicillin-resistant *S. aureus* (MRSA), further elevates its clinical importance. Preventing *S. aureus* transmission in healthcare settings relies on consistent infection-prevention practices: hand hygiene, appropriate PPE use, thorough cleaning and disinfection, CHG bathing when indicated, targeted decolonization strategies, and meticulous care of devices such as central lines.
